


HIGHLIGHTS 2017

The WFSA works tirelessly to close the gap in anaesthesia and surgery provision that has left 5 of the world's 7 billion people without access to safe and affordable care when needed. 2017 was a year of successful education and training, and increased international advocacy. The scale of the crisis is so huge that it is impossible for one organisation working alone to make a difference and so the WFSA is extremely grateful for the support of our network of 130+ Member Societies, and of our other partners, who contribute to our projects around the world.

THE HIGHLIGHTS

- The WFSA launched the Global Anaesthesia Workforce Map and published a related article in Anaesthesia & Analgesia. The map and data highlights the crisis in anaesthesia workforce density and shows, that more than 136,000 physician anaesthesia providers are needed *today* to achieve, as an interim target, a density of 5 per 100,000 population in all countries, especially in LMICs.
- The WFSA contributed at the World Health Assembly (WHA) in Geneva. The WFSA co-hosted What's next for surgery & anaesthesia? Civil society & global solutions, alongside Lifebox and the InciSioN student network, which focused on the surgery and anaesthesia workforce as well as the WFSA Global Position Statement on Anaesthesiology and Universal Health Coverage which highlights the need for WFSA and anaesthesiologist leadership in addressing the crisis. Additionally, we were integral in ensuring the decision to report on the implementation of WHA Resolution 68.15 every 3 years.
- As part of the scale-up of SAFE courses around the world with over 2,500 anaesthesia providers now trained, the WFSA launched "Happy Birth Days", a short film about the impact of SAFE Obstetric anaesthesia courses in Tanzania. The film followed nurse anaesthetist Prosper Protas as he visited a former obstetric patient and her baby, while reflecting on the impact of the SAFE course.
- 43 fellows undertook fellowships in 20 institutions, across 12 countries and 8 specialties during 2017. The WFSA also announced a new Cardiac Anaesthesia Fellowship in Bangalore!
- With support from Baxter, Diamedica, Gradian, and Masimo, the WFSA sponsored 31 scholars from 19 countries to attend 6 congresses in Sri Lanka (SAARC-AA), Switzerland (Euroanesthesia), the USA (ASA's Anesthesiology), Uruguay (CLASA), Gabon (SARANF), and Nigeria (AAAC).
